### **TLT'S OBJECTIVE**




# Who we served in 2023: by Gender







# Self-Reported Veteran Status of Participants via Survey




#### Low- and Moderate-Income Participant Results

Based on current data provided by zipdatamaps the following highlighted zip codes deemed the poorest across Texas. 515 participants to date of the 972 individuals we have served in one or more of our online, in-person or remote programs. This results in 52.98% of our participants coming from low-income communities. Including moderate income zip codes, TLT is at 59.26%.










**TLT Youth Leadership** Academy is a fourweek program presented by TLT-**Tomorrow's Leaders** Today to any interested 5th to 12th grade student. homeschool or private school student, held three times a year. **Community focused** sessions are 3 hours long, once a week ending with a certificate of graduation.



This educational program experience explores personal communication and leadership dynamics, community social service organizations, their community's history and growth, higher education and career opportunities, resume creating/review, financial literacy. community safety & local government. Participants work with their class using their leadership skills to complete a class project that will benefit their community.

**TLT Unlocking the Future** 



Basic real life soft-skills, higher education and career readiness through group discussions, hands on exercises, speakers and presentations about the civic, corporate, charitable and educational opportunities right in their community. The classes each will complete a community project. Ages 13-21

**Leadership Anna** 



A six-week leadership program presented in partnership with TLT by the Greater Anna Chamber of Commerce. Community focused sessions are 3 hours long, once a week ending with a graduation. Ages 18+

**TLT Kids Serve Volunteer Events** 



TLT Kids Serve is a volunteer program where youth 5th grade to 9th grade participates in volunteer project. These projects are in partnership with other nonprofits, completed in a classroom setting and include a financial literacy lesson and/or a real-life or soft-skill lesson.

Youth 10th to 12th grade participate in these sessions as project lead assistants building on leadership skills in identifying projects, coordinating and planning for the session and assisting with the facilitation of the project.




