TLT Youth Leadership Academy



TLT Youth Leadership Academy is a program for any interested 5th to 12th grade student, homeschool or private school student. Community focused sessions are 3 hours long, once a week for four weeks or one week of sessions, ending with a certificate of graduation.



TLT Leading Leaders Interns

Our Leading Leaders Interns program strives to provide each participant, ages 15 and older, living in Texas, hands-on opportunities to gain valuable experience to integrate with their career path in mind while developing leadership qualities and skills with curriculum-based opportunities. These positions are all REMOTE, allowing us to serve many young adults in many locations, inclusive to all. Experience is not necessarily required.

Veterans Gateway Program



Our Veterans Gateway Program prepares you for your next career move. Included is the Occupational Code Crosswalk that demonstrates how to translate military skills, training, and experience into civilian credentialing appropriate for civilian jobs. Service members will document their military career experience and skills, translate their military occupation experience to civilian occupations and skills, and identify any gaps that need to be filled to meet their career goals.

Participants ages 14+ interested in starting a small business or nonprofit learn what is involved with taking their dream to the next level.

What Makes TLT Different?

We are a 501(c)(3) nonprofit youth leadership program that is putting the focus on real life soft skills, civic responsibility, and career and leadership skills.

We work with participants 5th grade and older throughout Texas, mostly in underserved, economically challenged situations, to integrate their career goals, while developing leadership qualities and real-life skills. Engagement with business, civic, and community leaders that are aligned with their career choice leads to more meaningful connections.

The selection of class facilitators, mentors, retreats, internships and community service projects foster these relationships. The participant will learn how to be a self-sufficient community member and leader in any career they choose.

We would be honored to have Veterans who would like an opportunity to join us and put their mentoring and leadership skills into action or participate in an internship position.



TLT Kids Serve

TLT Kids Serve is a volunteer program in partnership with other nonprofits where 5th grade to 9th grade students participate in volunteer projects. These projects are completed in classroom settings and include a financial literacy lesson and/or a real life or soft skill lesson.

10th to 12th grade students participate as project lead assistants, building on leadership skills in identifying projects, coordinating and planning, and assisting with project facilitation.

Leadership Anna



Leadership Anna is presented by the Greater Anna Chamber of Commerce. Each session explores leadership dynamics, social service organizations, economic development, educational, leisure, public safety, Anna's government, and health services. Each member will work with their class building on and using their leadership skills to complete a class project that will benefit the Anna, Texas community.



Unlocking the Future Program

Our Unlocking the Future Program covers basic real life skills, soft skills, higher education, career readiness, financial literacy, and a class community project. Through group discussions, hands on exercises, speakers and presentations about the civic, corporate, charitable and educational opportunities they learn what is right in their community.
